One for All & All for One: Collaboration is a Lifesaving Strategy

• Preventing animal cruelty (i.e. Laurens County, Charleston Animal Society, Anderson County PAWS and HSUS). An initial puppy mill bust led with the support of No Kill South Carolina made Laurens County understand that it was possible to fight animal cruelty in their county- they've saved more than 1150 animals saved from inhumane conditions since the beginning of 2020!

- Moving animals to safety (i.e. Chester County Animal Care & Control and 17 SC animal welfare organizations).
